FUNERAL OBSEQUIES.—The remains of Miss Elizabeth Helenor Clarke, (the eldest daughter of Mr. W. Murray Clarke, the respected agent of H. R. Hughes, Esq., of Kinnel) who died on Wednesday the 13th inst., were consigned to their last resting place in the family vault in the parish churchyard of St. Geogre on Monday last. The deceased was very much respected in the neighbourhood for her amiability and readiness to help in any good cause. She had only reached her twenty-fourth year, but the seeds of that insidious disease, consumption, had taken firm hold of her constitution for some time.
